Lens vents prevent moist air from being trapped behind the lens. And a special gasket material between lenses keeps them both parallel, in a perfect arc for minimum distortion.

For less severe conditions, you may want the O/90. It has all the features of the O/90V except for the lens vents.

Both goggles come with another innovation: Oakley's Bronze lens color combination. An orange outer and gray inner

lens combine to form a unique light-gathering system that actually helps delineate terrain in low-light conditions. Yet it effectively fights glare. So it's the best all-around lens you can take skiing.

Or, you can get our new orange lens (orange outer, clear inner) for extreme low-light conditions.
